

SUD Monitoring Programs Pilot Study

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Pilot Study – Specific Aims

- To compare baseline program completion rates between established SUD monitoring programs and programs that adopt NCSBN's evidencebased guidelines.
- To track study participants through re-entry to practice after successful SUD program completion.
- To compare program attrition rates between established SUD monitoring programs and programs that adopt NCSBN's evidence-based guidelines.



Procedures – Study Sample

- Nurses enrolled in SUD monitoring programs that agree to implement the NCSBN guidelines and data collection procedures comprise the sample.
- Enrollment began on September 1, 2022. Nurses who enrolled in a participating SUD program within one year of this enrollment start date are participating in the study.
- 11 Jurisdictions are participating in the study.



Procedures – NCSBN Guidelines

Program length

• 3 years without a relapse is sufficient length

Frequency of check-ins

Daily

• Including holidays & weekends

Frequency of drug testing

At least 2 tests/month

Random in time and type of test

Structured support group

At least 2 meetings/month

Mutual Support Group

At least 1 meeting/week

Procedures - Timeline

- Phase I, a replication of the 2020 SUD Monitoring Program analysis, consists of nurses starting in a participating SUD monitoring program between September 1, 2022, and August 31, 2023.
- These nurses are being followed through program completion (approximately 3 years).
- In Phase II, nurses will be tracked for re-entry to practice through the year 2027 (approximately 2 years).



Procedures – Data Collection Schedule

- Participant Characteristics Data -- Fall 2023 (after entire cohort identified)
- Contract Data -- Fall 2023 (after entire cohort identified)
- Process Data (relapse data, drug test data, checkin data, ...) – Every Six Months
- End of Program Data Fall 2027
